PACCo - Promoting Adaptation to Changing Coasts

Promoting Adaptation to Changing Coasts (PACCo) is a €26m initiative, €17.8m of which is provided by the European Regional Development fund, which is supported by the European Union's Interreg V A France Channel England programme. It will demonstrate a range of benefits for people and the environment by adapting to climate change. Two typical estuarine sites – one in Devon, England and one in Normandy, France, will be developed to include climate change adaptation features such as the removal of flood defences, adapting of infrastructure and development of new habitats. Engagement with the communities will be tailored and appropriate and a model produced for up to 70 similar sites to use.
